MINUTES OF THE 1ST QUARTER MEETING OF THE BOARD OF ADVISERS

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting started at 5:30 PM, with the following agenda:

- Member survey results and the associated decisions;
- Target systems;
- Friday Night Fights;
- Proximity cards for accessing the range;
- Reconstruction of the firing lines;
- Range Day Expo.

MEMBER SURVEY RESULTS

Member guests

Based on the results of the survey, it was decided to eliminate the “four visits” requirement. Previously, a guest was allowed to come with a member four times, after which the guest was required to apply for a membership in order to continue using the range. This requirement is no longer in effect. It means that the range staff will not monitor how often a member guest comes as long as such guest fills out the waiver and pays the required quest fees.

Family membership

Based on the results of the survey, a new membership level was introduced. Members can now add family members (wives, husbands, children) to their 1-year Gold membership for \$100 per family member.

Member service hours

Based on the results of the survey, it was decided to keep the “member service hours” policy in effect. Each membership level comes with a certain number of service hours that a member is encouraged to earn in order to keep the membership and help maintain and improve the range. There are many ways a member can contribute and, thus, earn his/her service hours. Please refer to Appendix 1 below for general guidelines. This information will also be useful for passing the membership application test since it was decided the test would include question(s) about the member service hours to ensure members understand the policy and know how to use it.

As part of this discussion, the Board brought up the idea of introducing a different form of membership – the retail membership – that would provide an ability to use the range as a member, however, with fewer requirements and, therefore, limited benefits. It was discussed and mutually agreed upon that, in the current circumstances, it would be difficult to introduce, administer, and enforce such membership. The idea was, therefore, dismissed.

TARGET SYSTEMS

Further, Linda McRae updated the Board on the progress with the automated target system that was purchased for the Rogers range last year. Due to difficulties with the development of the system as well as financial challenges on the seller’s side, the delivery of system was reported to be delayed until April this year. It was decided to wait until that time before taking further action.

The Board was also informed of the newly purchased steel target that had been used at one of the recent matches in a shotgun stage. It was decided that the target would be used only for shotgun shooting (because of its height) and only during competitions until further notice.

As part of this discussion, Frankie McRae reported that construction of additional bays by the shoot house was ongoing and would be done as the budget allows.

FRIDAY NIGHT FIGHTS

The Board further elaborated on the ways to bring back the Friday Night Fights. It was decided that once the schedule permits and there is an RSO available to run the competition, the Friday Night Fights would be back, either on a monthly or quarterly basis. The event is up in the air.

PROXIMITY CARDS

Linda McRae updated the Board on the progress with the security gates that will require the use of the programmed proximity cards for accessing the facility. It was reported that the project was underway and would move to the next phase after the electrical installation was complete. Juan Barrera offered to assist with the facilitation of the project.

RECONSTRUCTION OF THE FIRING LINES

Frankie McRae informed the Board of the plans to reconstruct benches on both sides of the firing lines (100-yard and 25-yard lines). The reconstruction will be done in phases to minimize the closure times of the firing lines.

RANGE DAY EXPO

The Range Day Expo scheduled for May 13, 2017 was brought up to the Board's attention. The Board was asked to spread the word about the event. Members interested to participate, please refer to Appendix 2 below.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was closed at 6:30 PM. Board Advisers will convene in June, 2017 for their next quarterly meeting.
